Grace's Briscoe Named Crossroads League AD of the Year for Fourth Time

JACKSON, Mich. – Grace's Chad Briscoe has been named the 2021-2022 Crossroads League Athletic Director of the Year for the second-straight year and the fourth time during his tenure with the Lancers.

"I am humbled to receive this award," stated Briscoe. "It is a direct reflection of the tremendous coaches and student-athletes we have here at Grace and their commitment to working with Christian excellence throughout the year. I am thankful for the platform we have been given at Grace College to live out and share Christ in the arena of athletics. I serve alongside outstanding Athletic Directors in the league. They are all friends who work at an extremely high level, who sharpen me professionally and who work with excellence on a daily basis."

Briscoe was also heralded as the 2022 NAIA AD of the Year by NACDA, after his work during the 2021-2022 year with the Lancers, as well as with various NAIA leadership positions.

Under Briscoe's guidance, Grace sent six teams to the NAIA National Championships during the current year, highlighted by the GC outdoor track and field programs posting their best seasons in school history and the men's basketball program having its most successful season since 1991-1992.

The successes carried over into the academic realm for Grace Athletics as well, with the Lancers seeing each varsity team achieve NAIA Scholar-Team status for a fifth-straight season and posting the highest department GPA in school history.

Briscoe remains heavily involved with multiple national committees at the NAIA level as well, including serving as a member of the National Administrative Council. Briscoe also serves as the vice chair for the NAC's Executive Committee, works as the NAC's sport liaison for men's basketball and holds a spot on the NAIA Men's Basketball Selection Committee.

The Crossroads League Athletic Director-of-the-Year honor is voted on by the 10 Athletic Directors from the Crossroads League and announced each summer.

Marian's Huppert Repeats as Crossroads League SID of the Year

JACKSON, Mich. – The Crossroads League announced on Monday that Mitch Huppert of Marian University had been named its 2021-2022 Sports Information Director of the Year. The award is the second-straight for Huppert and the MU Sports Information Department.

“It is a true honor to be named the Crossroads League Sports Information Director of the Year for the second time in as many years,” said Huppert. “Our league has some of the best SIDs in the NAIA, and the work that each of them do have pushed me to bring my best each day. This year was extremely fun while challenging, working primarily as a one-man office while covering 26 sports for much of the year, and I give immense credit to Manager of Athletics Marketing Will Hunker, along with Marian faculty Mark Erdosy and Brett Cope, as well as my student-worker team for their help this year. I also would like to thank our Director of Athletics Steve Downing and Assistant AD Cassie Mackell, for their support working through this busy year. Without everyone’s help and support, this honor is not possible. The privilege to work with the great student-athletes and coaches we have at Marian is truly unique, and I am thankful for their trust in me to travel with them and share their stories.”

During the 2021-2022 year, Huppert and his department released over 740 articles and 100 videos on MUKnights.com and its various social media platforms. Additionally, Huppert oversaw the hosting of four CL Championship events, served on the tournament committee for the CL Softball Tournament and helped Marian host NAIA Championship events for women’s basketball, women’s soccer, volleyball and football.

Huppert also took on extra responsibilities for Marian Athletics at various times during the 2021-2022 year, helping the department fill short-term vacancies within the Leadership Team, as well as the Athletics Marketing offices.

“I would like to congratulate Mitch on being named the CL SID of the Year,” said MU Director of Athletics Steve Downing. “He is not only a great SID, but he is a great administrator as well. This department could not function without the abilities and skills that he brings day to day in helping me run this Athletics Department. All of our coaches and staff know how good of a SID Mitch is, and this honor is well deserved.”

Marian Claims 2021-2022 Crossroads League All-Sports Trophy

JACKSON, Mich. – In the tightest finish for the Crossroads League All-Sports Championship since 2016-2017, Marian edged Indiana Wesleyan by 1.5 points to take the 2021-2022 crown. The title marked the second-ever for the Knights, mirroring MU's same narrow margin over IWU in that 2016-2017 season.

"I think it is a great honor to win the Crossroads League All-Sports Trophy because of how tough it is to win, and with how tough the competition is in the Crossroads League," stated MU Director of Athletics Steve Downing. "To me, winning this speaks volumes on the number of quality coaches we have and the job that they do. I really appreciate having them and the efforts they put in each year, which means an immense amount to not only myself but to our President (Daniel J. Elsener) as well."

Marian won regular season Crossroads League Championship in volleyball, women's basketball, men's indoor track, women's indoor track, men's bowling, men's outdoor track and women's outdoor track. The Knights backed up those seven championships with seven more second-place finishes and ultimately finished top-three in the CL standings in 16-of-20 sports during the 2021-2022 year.

The top finishes led to 168.5 points in the CL All-Sports Standings for Marian, setting a new league record for the highest point total and topping IWU (167.0) in the two-team race for the top spot. The Knights also secured the highest point total on the men's side with 75.0 points and finished second in the women's standings to Indiana Wesleyan with 84.5 points.

Points for the Crossroads League All-Sports Championship are awarded based on each team's finish in the regular season standings, or for a team's finish at the league championship event for the sports of cross country, golf, competitive cheer and indoor and outdoor track and field. A first-place finish earns 10 points, with nine points for second, eight for third and so on, until each team is given a point value.

FORT WAYNE, Ind. - Purdue Fort Wayne women's basketball head coach Maria Marchesano has announced coaching staff changes for the 2022-23 season. Jazmyne Geist has been promoted to the full-time third assistant coach role and Quincy Cunningham will fill the graduate assistant coach position.

Geist takes over for Hannah Albrecht, who stepped away from the program to pursue other opportunities. The Fort Wayne native spent the last year as the graduate assistant coach for the Purdue Fort Wayne women's basketball program. In her first season with the Mastodons, Geist helped the program make a significant jump in nearly all statistical categories. The Mastodons won nine games, and seven in Horizon League play, both of which were the most for the program since the 2013-14 season. Geist will assume her new role effective immediately.

"Jaz has done a great job for us this past year and I am excited to see her grow in this new role," Marchesano said. "She has a passion for this game and for this city, and has a great rapport with the kids in our program. Her responsibilities will change but I know her impact will continue to be felt as she spends more time on the court and with recruits."

Cunningham spent the last year as a Player Development Assistant for the University of Maryland women's basketball program. While Cunningham was working with Maryland, the Terrapins went 23-9 and went to the Sweet 16. The Terps also had five wins over AP Top 25 teams. Cunningham assisted in individual player and team on-court workouts, served as a practice player, and assisted in film breakdowns. Maryland spent the entire season in the AP Top 25, climbing as high as No. 2.

"We are excited to bring Quincy on to our staff as a graduate assistant," Marchesano said. "He really stood out through the interview process first and foremost because of his energy and passion for this game, but on top of that he has a great background with working with the Maryland women's basketball team. The experience he gained being a part of their practice squad and handling a lot of the scout team responsibilities will be a huge asset to our program."

The first official day of the 2022-23 women's basketball season is on November 8.
