Right-Handed Pitcher Nolan Clenney's Contract Transferred to New York Mets

GARY, Ind.- Gary SouthShore RailCats' right-handed pitcher Nolan Clenney's contract has been transferred to the New York Mets after playing an integral role in the RailCats bullpen in the first half of the season.

Clenney is the third RailCat to have his contract transferred to a Major League organization this season, and the second RailCat to make the move to the Mets after David Griffin had his contract transferred just two weeks ago.

Masterful in late innings, Clenney has the best pitching numbers on the RailCats. Over 11 appearances, ten of which in relief, Clenney has thrown 20.2 innings of two-run baseball to deliver a clamp-down

0.88 ERA.

What's even more impressive is Clenney's strikeouts and walks. The Raleigh, North Carolina native has shoved 26 strikeouts to just three walks on the year to boast a team-best 8.7 K/BB ratio. Clenney also tops the RailCats in walks per nine innings, hits per nine innings, and WHIP.

A product of NC State, Clenney has a powerful four-seam delivery with a sweeping slider and deceiving off-speed. He opened the season with 14 shutout innings, and after allowing his only runs of the season against Chicago on June 18, Clenney has thrown 5.2 scoreless innings with just two hits allowed and has struck out nine.

#### 'Cats Held Off by Canaries in Finale

SIOUX FALLS, S.D.- In the series finale, the Gary SouthShore RailCats (17-20) fell to the Sioux Falls Canaries (18-18) in a 12-8 final at The Birdcage in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, resulting in the highest scoring game the RailCats have played this season.

Each of the Sioux Falls' starters recorded at least one hit in the win while Canaries' lead-off man Wyatt Ulrich went 5-for-5 with a home run, a triple, four runs and two RBI.

The Canaries jumped out to a 1-0 lead in the first, but Jackson Smith snatched the advantage back for the RailCats with a two-RBI single in the second frame. Smith recorded a 2-for-3 day with two RBI at the dish, his first multi-hit effort of the year.

In the third, the Birds took the lead back with a four-run frame on back-to-back two-RBI base knocks, first a single from Jabari Henry and then a double from Trey Michalczewski. Henry kept his bat hot in a 3-for-4 showing with two runs and two RBI while Michalczewski went 2-for-4 with a pair of runs driven in.

A Daniel Lingua RBI double cut the game to 5-4 in the sixth, but the Canaries delivered six runs in the bottom of the frame on two home runs and an RBI triple on seven hits in the inning to take the 11-4 lead.

RailCats starter Jack Alkire suffered the loss, allowing 11 runs on 14 hits in six innings..

Gary SouthShore sliced back into the lead in the top of the eighth capped off by a bases clearing, three-RBI double by the veteran Zach Welz.

Yet, with a three-run lead, the Birds added one more to bring us to the 12-8 final in the series finale.

The Gary SouthShore RailCats have a day off tomorrow, and then open a three-game series on Tuesday, June 29 with 6:30 p.m. first pitch at Northwestern Medicine Field in Geneva, Illinois.
